# ICELAND: LAND OF FIRE, ICE, & SO MUCH MORE



Excitement, anticipation and a brisk wind were in the air when we boarded the bus March 17 to Chicago to begin our adventure. Little did we know how much wind would shape our trip experience. Our favorite bus driver Dan transported us to O'Hare, and we were on our way. After an overnight IcelandAir flight, a beautiful sunrise and snow-covered scene greeted us as we landed at Reykjavik. We met our fabulous tour guide, Snorri Stein, who took us to a bakery for treats and introduced us to the city's highlights. The welcome dinner on the waterfront of shell-fish soup, filet of beef, potatoes, broccoli and chocolate cake with ice cream and berries drew rave reviews. Note to future travelers with Roger Schnelten: he loves beef, will take any you don't eat, and don't let him set the tip standard for drinks.

Much-needed rest energized us for our trip the next day to the Snaefellsnes Peninsula with its glaciers, mountains, rugged shoreline and strong winds. We found out why we needed layers of clothes topped by wind pants, coats and snug hats. The reward: Spray from whales was visible from the walk along the coast.

The next day our guide at the Aurora Northern Lights Center explained what causes the lights and how differently humans' eyes and cameras view them. We learned how to take pictures of them with our cameras. We then left Reykjavik and headed for the Golden Circle without one traveler's purse. But we had vonin (the Icelandic word for hope) that the purse would turn up.

We saw where the Asian-European tectonic plate collides with the North American tectonic plate at Thingvellir National Park. At an outdoor geothermal bakery in Laugarvatn, we helped dig out two covered pots from the hot sands. The pots held sweet, aromatic Icelandic rye bread

that had baked overnight. It was delicious served with butter and smoked trout.

We hiked into a steaming geothermal field at Geysir. The first eruptions of the flooded crater didn't impress, but eventually it produced higher streams. Then we ooh-ed and aah-ed at the spectacular double waterfall of Gullfoss. The spray from the falls and the light bouncing off the ice created a surreal scene with rainbows. We enjoyed a brief stop to pet and feed tiny Icelandic horses.

Typical for Iceland, the weather did an about face and blew us away—literally. A threatening storm materialized. Our impressive guide, Snorri, changed our sightseeing itinerary, hotel and dinner location for the next 1 ½ days as we raced to Vic, a tiny town of 300 residents. Our fearless bus driver Sal shepherded us through whiteout blasts of snow, ice and black sand. Extremely high winds caught several by surprise as we unloaded luggage and made our way to the hotel entrance. Some were "grounded" as the wind spun their luggage or them!

The next day while the storm raged with occasional 100 mph wind gusts, Sal and Snorri offered us an outing to have lunch and see real lava flow at the Lava Center in town. Afterward, we fueled up at liquor and grocery stores. Then we returned to the hotel to take advantage of the game room with a pool table, ping pong table and darts. Some people played cards. Most drank.



And this was our lucky day. We learned that the lost purse had been found and would be at our hotel when we returned to Reykjavik. Nothing was taken.

We delayed our departure from Vik until the wind eased and travelled to "Klaustur". A hike or two in the snow and awesome surroundings brought out our smiles with the sun. A provided dinner at the hotel was greatly appreciated.

On our way back to Reykjavik we stopped at sights we missed during the storm. First the Vatnajokull National Park, where we hiked over land once covered by the shrinking glacier right up to a frozen waterfall hidden from above. Then we stopped to walk Reynisfjara Black (Sand) Beach, with a warning to watch for "sneaker waves," which arrive suddenly and can sweep an adult out to sea.

We took our group picture at the beautiful and dramatic Skogafoss waterfall. We toured a museum and learned about earthquakes and how there are hundreds of small ones every day in Iceland. We capped our sightseeing with beer-tasting at a microbrewery. Then we returned to Reykjavik.

What we had not been able to do so far was see the Northern Lights. Some people went to the waterfront in Reykjavik without any sightings. But we had vonin (hope). Our final day of touring led us to the Reykjanes Peninsula. We hiked at a bubbling geothermal site and at a huge lava field left from the eruption two years earlier. Then we "chilled" in the 100-degree mineral-filled water of the Blue



Lagoon. We soaked in the total experience, enjoying a drink and a facial mud pack. Then the bus took us back to the city to enjoy a wonderful farewell dinner. However, Sal and Snorri agreed to take us on an additional excursion so we could have one last chance to see the Northern Lights in the countryside. It was a clear cold night. We drove to a remote location. And we witnessed the spectacular Northern Lights drama evolving all around us. We snapped dramatic pictures until our hands and bodies could take the cold no more.

Everyone agreed it was the perfect way to end a great trip. And this great group of travelers embraced the unexpected with eagerness, enthusiasm and enjoyment!

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#### STANDING RULE #2

#### CANCELLATION & REFUND POLICY (11/14/96), (Amended 5/13/99, 4/9/05 and 1/8/15)

"Cutoff' dates and non-refundable deposits for trips and activities may vary according to transportation, lodging or other associated deposits. Cutoff dates for trips and activities will be established for each trip or activity by the Executive Board and published in the monthly newsletter. All cancellations must be made to the Trip Leader in writing or via e-mail. Refunds will be made as follows:

- For cancellations before the published cutoff date, a full refund of all monies paid will be issued in a timely manner, less any
  Executive Board-approved cancellation processing fee established and published in conjunction with the trip or activity
  advertisement in the monthly newsletter.
- 2. For cancellations after the cutoff date, refunds will be as follows:
  - a. For any trip or activity where the allotted number of spaces are completely reserved and a replacement can be found, a cancellation may be made and a full refund issued, less any processing fees, as described in paragraph 1, above, any time prior to the departure of the trip or the start of the activity, provided the replacement person pays the full amount due, in accordance with the payment schedule for the trip or activity.
  - b. If a replacement cannot be found, the member canceling the trip or activity may submit, in person, in writing, or via email, a request for a refund. This request must be sent to either the trip leader, the appropriate VP or directly to the Executive Board. The request must be submitted within 15 days after the scheduled start date of the trip or activity and shall state the reason for the cancellation and the amount of refund requested. Requests will only be considered by the Executive Board, and refunds will only be made, once the trip or activity is completed and the full financial statement has been submitted for review and approval, as described in Standing Rule #13. Any refund approved by the Executive Board will come from recoverable expenditures derived from the specific trip or activity and not from the Club's general fund.
  - c. Refunds will be distributed no later than 180 days after the first scheduled day of the trip or activity.

## STANDING RULE #5 TRIP MANAGEMENT AND CONDUCT (11/14/96), (Amended 4/9/05 and 1/8/15)

- 1. All Trip Leaders shall be at least 21 years of age.
- 2. Trips shall be run as advertised, unless ski conditions, safety or wellbeing of trip participants dictate otherwise, in which case, the decision for an alternate plan rests with the Vice President of Ski Trips, Day Trips. or Tour Trips (as appropriate) or the President prior to departure. After departure, this authority rests with the trip leader.
- 3. Conduct by any individual which is offensive or hazardous to others or that does not project a good image of the Club could result in expulsion from the trip at the nearest place of public lodging or transportation by the authority of the trip leader. The trip leader will provide a review of the circumstances at the next Executive Board meeting with a board decision to maintain or cancel the individual's Club membership.
- 4. Individuals will be held responsible for any damage to personal or real property of others.
- 5. Club arranged accommodations cannot be shared with non-trip participants.

## STANDING RULE #7 GROUND TRANSPORTATION SMOKING POLICY (11/14/96)

- Smoking will only be allowed during scheduled stops approximately every two hours of travel, if requested. NO smoking inside the travel vehicle is allowed.
- 2. Trips under two hours in duration will be classified as "non-smoking trips."

#### STANDING RULE #8 PARTIAL SKI TRIP PACKAGES (11/14/96) (amended 4/9/05)

- 1. For trips involving a request to delete air (or other packaged form of transportation) service, only the actual cost of the ticket will be deducted from the trip price. The participant's portion of the club's overhead cost, including ground transportation to the airport or rail station used for the trip, will be included in the partial trip price.
- All requests for partial trip packages will only be honored to the point where the Club may drop reserved seats without penalty from the tour
  operator and/or the carrier.
- 3. If a request for a partial trip participation is made and honored, the participant must make payment in the full amount within 5 days of the approval notification. A "partial" trip payment is not refundable unless the trip is canceled. CANCELLATION CUT-OFF DATES DO NOT APPLY. The club will not refund or attempt to "resell" partial trip packages should the participant drop from the trip any time after payment is made.
- 4. Requests to exclude lift tickets from a trip package must be made at the time of sign up. Requests for partial trip packages, including lift tickets, will only be honored to the point where the Club may drop such tickets, or other items, without penalty or loss of income (including any comp). Unless otherwise approved by the Vice President of Ski Trips, the member requesting "no lifts" will pay the full trip price. After the trip is completed, the unused lift ticket will be returned by the Club to the tour operator or the ski area for possible refund. Any refund will then be made to the member by Club check. Refunds may not be possible if purchase and use of a lift ticket by all trip participants is required for the Club to receive a discounted "group rate."
